Summary and Update

LD 820 would force Maine citizens to pay for abortions with their tax dollars. It also would force family-owned businesses to cover abortion services in their health insurance benefit packages. We had a very effective public hearing, and the work session produced a partisan 8-5 vote in *favor* of the bill. <u>The</u> <u>only way this bill is stopped is if your legislators hear your</u> <u>opposition.</u>

We believe there's a good chance the House will be voting on LD 820 on Tuesday, May 7. I can't emphasize how important it is for you to call <u>and</u> email your legislators.
